The North Carolina Coal Institute, Inc., was organized by coal representatives living in the North Carolina area in the spring of 1946 at the Sheraton Hotel, High Point, N.C. The By Laws were adopted, that same year, by the membership and on November 13, 1946, the late Hon. Thad Eure, Secretary of North Carolina, presented our corporate charter during the meeting held in the O'Henry Hotel, Greensboro, N.C.

The membership, comprised mainly of major coal producers, was subsequently enlarged to include representatives of the railroads, coal consuming industrials, utilities, manufacturers of coal combustion and handling equipment, and coal related service companies. The membership now encompasses most of the United States.

The goal of the NCCI is to promote business and dialogue between member companies, present topical programs at the spring, summer, and fall meetings, educate the membership about current events and legislation pertaining to coal mining and the use of coal, and present educational assistance to schools, civic organizations, media and governmental agencies about the use and benefits of coal.
