- REPUBLICAN MAJORITY IN CONGRESS
 - U.S. HOUSE: 239 194 (TWO OPEN GOP SEATS)
 - U.S. SENATE: 52-48 (SPECIAL ELECTION IN ALABAMA IN DEC 2017)
- TRUMP ADMINISTRATION STILL IN FORMATION
 - 1,242 APPOINTEES REQUIRE SENATE APPROVAL; 600 KEY POSTS
 - OF 600 KEY POSITIONS, 273 HAVE NO NOMINEE NAMED
 - 177 FORMALLY NOMINATED OR NOMINEE NAMED; 145 CONFIRMED

SO WHAT'S NEXT?

LEGISLATIVELY....

- CONGRESSIONAL SESSIONS ENDS <u>DECEMBER 18</u>
- TAX REFORM IS FRONT AND CENTER AFTER SEPT. "BIG 6" PROPOSAL:
 - SETS THE CORPORATE TAX RATE AT 20%;
 - CUTS INDIVIDUAL RATES AND DOUBLES STANDARD DEDUCTIONS
 - ELIMINATES THE ALTERNATIVE MINIMUM TAX AND ESTATE TAX
 - WOULD LIMIT "SALT" INTEREST DEDUCTIBILITY FOR SOME
- WILL UTILIZE "BUDGET RECONCILLIATION" TO AVOID FILIBUSTER
 - HOUSE AND SENATE BUDGET RESOLUTIONS ARE MILES (AKA, \$1.5 TRILLION) APART
 - ONCE BUDGET RESOLUTION IS AGREED TO, WAYS/MEANS + FINANCE CAN WRITE TAX BILLS

- INFRASTRUCTURE GAS TAX INCREASE? PPPs? EARMARKS?
- DEFICIT DEBT CEILING REINSTATED ON DEC. 8
- HEALTHCARE ALEXANDER/MURRAY BILL AWAITS IT FATE
- INTERNATIONAL ROCKETMAN, RAQQA, ROUHANI
- ENERGY MURKOWSKI/CANTWELL COMPREHENSIVE ENERGY
 BILL FROM JUNE 2017; AWAITING SENATE FLOOR TIME

ALL IN THE NAME OF NOV. 2018

- U.S. HOUSE AND 34 SENATE SEATS UP FOR ELECTION
- MIDTERM ELECTIONS NORMALLY BAD FOR PARTY IN W.H.
 - 18 OF 20 LAST MIDTERMS, PRESIDENT'S PARTY LOST AVG. 33 SEATS
 - PRESIDENTIAL APPROVAL HISTORICALLY INFLUENCES THIS TREND
- BUT 2018 ISN'T NORMAL!
 - DEMOCRATS MUST DEFEND 25 SEATS, INCLUDING 10 "RED" SEATS
 - U.S. HOUSE MORE COMPETITIVE WITH MODERATE GOP RETIREMENTS

IS THE OLD DOMINION A PREVIEW OF 2018?

- DEMOCRAT RALPH NORTHAM V. REPUBLICAN ED GILLESPIE
 - NORTHAM IS LT. GOV; GILLESPIE IS 2014 SENATE CANDIDATE
- POLLS SHOW NORTHAM WITH SINGLE DIGIT LEAD; NOVA KEY
- HISTORICALLY, VIRGINIA DOES NOT PREDICT SUBSEQUENT CONGRESSIONAL MIDTERM ELECTION
 - BUT TURNOUT MECHANISMS, ENTHUSIASM ARE GAUGED HEAVILY
